## How predicting terrorist acts **currently works**







Analytical tools such as artificial intelligence assess huge amounts of data, delivered every day from many sources across the globe.

They contain datasets of past patterns of behaviour which they are programmed to use, in order that they can help human beings understand potentially dangerous situations better.

We will never dispense with AI, sentiment analysis, machine learning, etc. It's a growth industry, and may even deserve to be – even *after* the lessons of 9/11.

Plenty of work is being carried out with the above, but in all cases the achievements of such systems rely exclusively on using past patterns – and tech's number-crunching strategies – to identify potential future acts of terrorism.


## What does the **Neo-Terrorism** platform focus on instead?

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#### It wasn't prevented **by systems that have humans as extensions of machines**.

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
Why use Experts?


Why capture and validate Expert thought?

An expert is not paid to crunch numbers – anyone can be trained to carry out what is essentially a repetitive task, with little imagination required.

An expert is paid to have ideas sooner than anyone else; to anticipate trends before machines can; to predict the future so his or her organisation has the edge over the competition – in this case, has the edge over Neo-Terrorism.

But an expert often finds it difficult to efficiently share their ideas with other experts *and* laypeople.

The Neo-Terrorism platform makes this all possible: inclusively *and* efficiently.








## How the Neo-Terrorism platform works



STEP 1: User application download The app is compatible with smartphones and tablet devices, enabling your experts to carry out expert-thought sessions on the move and in any environment.

STEP 2: Expert-thought capture and validation session An Expert-thought session is recorded by the app and people in the room. Data can be recorded in any way people prefer: text, video, photos, etc.

STEP 3: Report Decision-makers view the session's data – once processed using internal analysts and automated AI systems – and are now able to make rapid and accurate decisions in an emotionally intelligent and security-savvy way.
